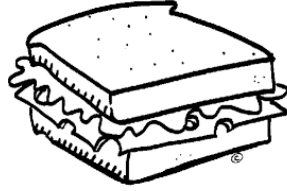

Fudge-a-Mania Author: Judy Blume (BLUE)	Fudge-a-mania by Judy Blume centers on the life of Peter Hatcher, a fifth grader, and his family vacation in Maine. The Pain and the Great One Author: Judy Blume (PINK)	The book follows the sibling rivalry between an eight-year old girl, "The Great One", and her younger six-year-old brother, "The Pain." The book is divided into two parts, one told from the viewpoint of each sibling; each one ends with the sibling complaining, "Mom says The Pain/The Great One is what she always wanted. Yuck! I think they love him/her more than me!" The girl refers to her brother as "The Pain," due to him always being a nuisance for her, while the boy calls his sister "The Great One," a sarcastic nickname based on her thinking herself the better sibling.
